8.4 Ings Lane

HDC Cllr A Wake gave an update on the current situation at Ings Lane. Councillor Ashton provided information on recent instances of fly tipping on private land at Ings Lane. Councillor Wake agreed to take this matter up with the relevant HDC departments.

8.5 Rospa Report - Equipment Repairs

Cllr O'Neill had met with Michael Cook and asked him to provide an estimate for replacing the climbing board up to the slide and also the roof of the playhouse. Due to the special nature of the materials it is thought it would cost between £800 - £1000. Mr Cook has been asked to go ahead with the repairs.

The Grass Cutting quote had been accepted and the first cuts of the year have taken place. Stephen Johnson has also removed 4 silver birch trees from the Holme as requested and Cllr O'Neill has ordered new saplings to be put in their place.
