MINUTES

MEETING HELD ON MONDAY 9TH MARCH, 2020

GREAT BROUGHTON VILLAGE HALL

20/43 PRESENT: Councillors David Ashton, Helen Eldabe, Robert Jones and David Moreton.

20/44 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE Councillors Geoff Ablett, Michael O'Neill and Susan Wilmot.

20/45 ALSO PRESENT: County Councillor Heather Moorhouse and District Councillors Bryn Griffiths and Andy Wake and 10 local residents.

20/46 CHAIR

RESOLVED that in the absence of the Chair, Councillor David Ashton chair this meeting.

20/47 CODE OF CONDUCT.

Councillor David Moreton declared a non pecuniary interest in Planning Application 19/02304/FUL.

20/48 POLICE REPORT

The Police Report for the period 16th February to March 9th showed one "Violence against the person" incident.

20/49 PUBLIC QUESTION TIME.

Members of the public voiced their objections to Application 20/00300/OUT- Proposal to construct 5 dwellings alongside Green Balk Ingleby Road.

20/50 MINUTES OF LAST MEETING.

The minutes of the meeting held on the 17th February 2020 were approved and signed as a true record by the Acting Chair.

20/51 PLAYGROUND REVIEW

With reference to Minute 20/31, HDC had agreed to carry out a funding search when more details were available. They had not yet responded as owner or in relation to planning and advice.

RESOLVED that this matter be deferred to our next meeting.

20/52 INGS LANE COURT ORDER

With reference to Minute 20/33, the District Council had secured the clearance of the site and were about to have it reseeded.

RESOLVED that to frustrate fly tipping the County Council be asked to consider putting a locked gate in Ings Lane with pedestrian and horse access with owners requiring access being given a key.

20/53 LORRIES IN KIRKBY LANE

With reference to Minute 20/40 a response was still awaited from Quorn. Kirkby Parish Council had raised a similar complaint last year.

20/54 LITTER BINS

With reference to Minute 20/41, a response was still awaited from HDC.

20/55 VEHICLE ACTIVATED SPEED SIGNS

With reference to Minute 20/30 the County Council had confirmed that electricity would be charged at £10 per sign per annum and HDC had confirmed that the purchase of these signs was an acceptable use of CIL money.

RESOLVED

1. That the agreement be entered into with the County Council to secure their consent to the installation and operation of the signs.
2. That the quotation from Swarco to supply and install the two signs at a cost of £5,800 +VAT be accepted.

20/56 GRASS AND HEDGE CUTTING CONTRACT 2020/21

There was a discussion on the desire to ensure that the public were aware that the Parish Council appointed contractors who acted in a professional way.

RESOLVED the tender from Stephen Johnson for Grass and Hedge cutting be accepted

RESOLVED that revised Standing Orders for the Council be adopted, a copy of which is attached to the signed copy of these minutes.

20/58 BETTER DEAL FOR BUS USERS CONSULTATION

RESOLVED that Stokesley Parish Council be supported in their request for more frequent services between Stokesley and Northallerton which would give a two hourly service for Great Broughton and also their request for consideration to be given to demand led services.

20/59 MOBILE POST OFFICE

The Council welcomed the introduction of the Mobile Post Office which would be in the Wainstones Hotel Car Park every Tuesday from 11.15am to 12.15pm starting on the 24th March.

20/60 DAMAGED FOOTWAY AND WALL AT THE WATER SPLASH

The County Council will be asked to carry out repairs to the dangerous footway fencing and damaged retaining wall at the Water Splash in the Holme.

20/61 FINANCE

20/62 PLANNING APPLICATIONS CONSULTATIONS

19/02304/FUL – Proposed construction of industrial warehouse at 6 Ellerbeck Way.

Councillor David Moreton having declared a non pecuniary interest did not vote on this matter.

RESOLVED that the District Council be advised that the Parish Council object to this proposal for the reasons now set out and that the application should be determined by the Planning Committee.

20/00300/OUT – Proposal construction of 5 dwellings on the south side of Green Balk Ingleby Road.

All the local residents present expressed their objection to this proposal.

RESOLVED

1 That the District Council be requested to amend the misleading description of the site of this proposal and then recommence the public consultation.

2 That the District Council be advised that the Parish Council object to this proposal for the reasons now set out and that the application should be determined by the Planning Committee.
