

GREAT AND LITTLE BROUGHTON PARISH COUNCIL
MINUTES OF AN ADDITIONAL PARISH COUNCIL MEETING HELD
IN GREAT BROUGHTON VILLAGE HALL AT 7PM ON THURSDAY 10TH AUGUST 2023

23.100 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE AND DECLARATION OF INTERESTS

Apologies for absence had been received from Helen Eldabe and Cathy Williamson. Cllr Jones and Cllr Towler declared interests in planning applications, shown within the minutes.

23.101 PUBLIC QUESTION TIME - Residents were invited to bring forward any additional items, but confirmed that all items of interest were within the agenda and the Chair approved that they could speak when invited during the items.

23.102 CRIME SITUATION IN GREAT BROUGHTON

PS Ross informed that incidents within Great and Little Broughton were very low with only one incident within the previous 365 days, but on the evenings of 18th and 23rd of July there had been 9 incidents. With 2 burglaries, and 7 auto crimes, there had been information received from CCTV footage of door handles being tried. The cars had been recovered within Middlesbrough. There had been no forced entries; the house doors had been open or unlocked. The people involved had been 14,15 and 17 year old inexperienced criminals and had been linked to similar incidents in Great Ayton and Northallerton. PC Ross gave assurances that the village had been patrolled and additional resources provided. He explained that if there were crimes reported ongoing additional support was given from different departments and forces, which was why a firearms car had been seen in the village and a drone was brought from Cleveland Police to support. There had been three suspects identified from the incidents and one locked up. A total of five youths were known and specialist ops/CID were assisting in arrests. The Chair questioned if Great and Little Broughton were getting their fair share of officers as these were not visible. PS Ross assured that there were patrols overnight but work was priority led and the larger villages had more issues. He confirmed that he had received the information on damage within the play park. He advised of a recent issue that one of his officers had faced in Great Broughton. He stated that he encouraged officers to sit in villages to be out in the community and visible when completing paperwork on their laptops. The officer from Stokesley Police had been approached by a resident and was challenged and verbally abused about sitting working on his laptop. This did not encourage the officers to sit within the community and enhance relationships. He asked that incidents were reported either by calling 999 or 101 depending on the incident or through the community messenger system. Details on this service were to be advised through the PCSO knocking on doors in the village and circulated via the new Facebook page for residents. A resident questioned ANPR cameras within the vicinity and questioned if residents were able to have a further camera installed near the village hall. This was to be progressed further, PC Ross informed that an officer had completed a bid for an additional camera for the Stokesley end of the A173.

PS Ross and PCSO Smith left the meeting.

23.103 PLANNING APPLICATIONS

23.103.1 Councillors discussed the following applications received and made the observations shown:

Planning applications

ZB23/01190/FUL - 46 High Street - no objection.

23/00620/LBC - Blue Hall, 14 The Holme - Cllr Jones declared an interest and left the room for the item, then re entered for the next item. Cllr Wilmot chaired for this item - no objection.

ZB23/01457/FUL - Holme End, 42 The Holme - no objection.

ZB23/01524/FUL - Ivy House, 94 High Street - Cllr Jones declared an interest - residents attending the meeting gave a strong representation showing the negative impact to their adjacent property. They explained issues with a large extension at the other side of their property. They felt that this proposed application for a 10ft flat roofed extension would be oppressive and take their light and destroy the amenity of their yard. **Resolved:** Councillors discussed the application and agreed that an objection be placed - E1M

the planning application design causes unacceptable harm to the amenity of homes nearby. The Parish Council requested that a planning officer visit the adjoining residents house to understand the impact.

2 residents left the meeting.

ZB23/01328/MRC - Ingleby Orchard, Green Balk - Cllr Towler declared an interest. Councillors discussed the retrospective application and the complaint received by residents. **Resolved:** Councillors discussed the application and agreed that an objection be placed - E1B and E1C the design is out of character and E3A the application would cause significant harm to biodiversity.

ZB23/01341/FUL - 3B Ellerbeck Court, Stokesley Business Park - no objection.

ZB23/01296/FUL - Ballard White House Farm - Councillors discussed the changed footprint and this being adjacent to a grade 2 listed building. **Resolved:** A Councillor felt that this application should be objected to, however this motion was not passed. No objection.

Decisions

22/02068/FUL - 23/00042/REFUSE - 6 Kirkby Lane - Appeal entered
